Dear Families,

Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) benefits are now available to **all K-8 students** enrolled in our school district. P-EBT is money for food for meals students missed at school during the school day because of the pandemic.

There is no need to apply to receive these benefits. Each eligible student will receive a P-EBT card in the mail. However, in order to ensure you receive these benefits, you will need to confirm your address on file with our district is up to date. The first payment date for these benefits has not yet been published, but the date will be prior to September 30, 2023.

Keep your P-EBT Card! More benefits may be added throughout the school year to students' EBT cards if:

- Schools remain closed OR
- If students continue to miss meals served during the school day due to reduced school hours.
